


# The Epistle

A story of another church's experience is rattling around in my head this week, tumbling through my thoughts on a Thursday morning, sabotaging my sabbath rest on Saturday. It's the story of a pretty bold move of a pastor in Watford, England, who felt his church was experiencing a bit of apathy in its worship of Jesus; a story told by artist Matt Redman, in a 2004 interview with Crosswalk.com:

"There was a dynamic missing, so the pastor did a pretty brave thing," [Redman] recalls. "He decided to get rid of the sound system and band for a season, and we gathered together with just our voices. His point was that we'd lost our way in worship, and the way to get back to the heart would be to strip everything away."

Reminding his church family to be producers in worship, not just consumers, the pastor, Mike Pilavachi, asked, "When you come through the doors on a Sunday, what are you bringing as your offering to God?"

Matt says the question initially led to some embarrassing silence, but eventually people broke into a cappella songs and heartfelt prayers, encountering God in a fresh way.

"Before long, we reintroduced the musicians and sound system, as we'd gained a new perspective that worship is all about Jesus, and He commands a response in the depths of our souls no matter what the circumstance and setting.

[Matt's song,] 'The Heart of Worship' simply describes what occurred."

When the music fades, all is stripped away, and I simply come

Longing just to bring something that's of worth that will bless your heart...

I'm coming back to the heart of worship, and it's all about You, Jesus

Redman remembers writing the song quickly in his bedroom soon after the church's journey together, with no grand intentions, by any means, for it to become an international anthem. He viewed the words simply as his personal, subjective response to what he was learning about worship. But when Matt shared "The Heart of Worship" with Pilavachi, the pastor suggested making a few small adjustments to the lyrics so any member of the church could relate to it as well.

## Financial Report Summaries

#### 2024 Year End

Our year end financials for 2024 were a good news, bad news kind of situation. The good news is that while we did end the year in a deficit, it was about a tenth of what we had anticipated. The bad news is that we spent much of the year under-staffed, and while we saved a great deal on personnel costs we overspent, primarily due to costs of facility maintenance and upkeep. In addition, our deferred maintenance needs continue to grow (for example, our nursery and pastor's office currently lack working heat).

We thank you for your continued faithful stewardship. Your elected volunteer leadership and church staff will continue to take seriously our responsibilities to be wise stewards of the resources you share toward the fulfillment of St. Paul's UMC's mission and vision.

#### **2024 BUDGET:**

Income from Offerings: \$ 586,694

Other Income: \$ 96,000

Total Income: \$ 682,694

Budgeted Expenses: \$752,842 Projected (Deficit): (\$70,148)

#### 2024 ACTUALS:

Income from Offerings: \$ 630,623 Other Income: \$ 119,595 Total Income: \$ 750,218

Actual Expenses: \$ 759,055 Actual (Deficit): (\$ 8,836)

At year end our operational cash reserve is \$144,218. In addition, there are \$201,117 in designated funds (meaning their use is restricted), and our mortgage balance is \$225,543.

#### 2025 Budget

In November, our Church Council leaders reviewed expense budget requests and actual spending from the last few years, reviewed a rough draft of anticipated giving for 2025, and set a budget for the new year. A one-sheet of the full budget will be available at our January Leadership Retreat. To the right is a summary of our 2025 Budget.

#### Major Gifts Campaign

On Sunday, February 16, 2025, we will launch a short-term major gifts campaign: "Retire the Debt & Re-Floor the Gym." We will be asking the 200 households who make St. Paul's their home church, as well as the additional 600 households that regularly utilize our gym for basketball and exercise, to help us reach our twin goals of eliminating our debt and funding a new sports floor for the Life Center gym. #### **Shared Youth Ministry Update – December & January**

Belong - Believe - Serve

In September 2024, we officially launched this Shared Youth Ministry, bringing together youth *from Christ Church UM, Desert Skies UMC, and St. Paul's UMC*. Our efforts have focused on building community through our core values of *Belonging, Faith Formation, and Service*.

## Sunday Evening Youth Group Events

#### **December 1: Starting Advent**

We started Advent by exploring traditions like Las Posadas and Christingle. We reflected on Wesleyan principles, encouraging youth to focus on growth during this season.

#### December 8: Serving with Love

Youth reflected on Matthew 5:16 and worked on the "Adopt a Grandparent" service project, creating crafts, bracelets, and letters to bring joy and share God's love during Advent.

## December 15: Youth Christmas Party

The event included making personal pizzas, a White Elephant gift game, decorating students as Christmas trees, and ending with s'mores around a warm fire.

## December 22: "Adopting a Grandparent"

We visited the adopted elder at Fellowship Square, sharing handmade gifts and a Christmas letter. Students listened to his story, felt inspired, and planned to stay in touch through calls, letters, and another visit in February.



#### **December 29: Bonfire and Fellowship**

Youth and leaders gathered at Desert Skies' bonfire area for reflection on 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 and Jeremiah 29:11, enjoying s'mores, fellowship, and learning pickleball.

#### January 2025 so far:

On January 12th, we started the year with connection and fun. We had optional basketball and dodgeball games, and students shared their hopes for the rest of the school year. We have planned a few outdoor activities, including a hike and board games. We also have been working on preparations for the confirmation classes, including getting the confirmands' imprinted Bibles ready. The first class, led by Pastor Ron and focused on *The Bible and Our Jewish Roots*, is scheduled for January 26.

#### A Journey of Growth: What's Next for our Shared Youth Ministry

#### <u>Upcoming Events/Sunday School/Confirmation Classes</u>

#### In February 2025, we have been planning events for the youth group, including:

- **February 2:** The Wesley Cup, which is a district-wide youth event featuring games, fellowship, and faith-filled activities, bringing youth together for fun and spiritual growth.
- February 9: Service project, continuation, following up to Adopting a Grandparent.
- February 16: Round1 Bowling & Arcade Park: this was a suggestion from our students and leaders.
- February 23: Pickleball and Outdoor volleyball at Desert Skies.
- March 2: Flandrau Science Center and Planetarium, focused on the Exhibits for hands-on activities.

<u>Sunday School</u>: We are looking for a curriculum to update Sunday school content and plan to launch it simultaneously in the second week of February at each church. The most promising option so far is <u>Echo 36: The Story</u>, starting with sessions 1-6 (for six Sundays) from the Cokesbury store. We will evaluate it and consider purchasing additional lessons if it meets our expectations.

#### Confirmation classes:

Session 1 (Sunday, January 26, 2025): The Bible and our Jewish Roots

Session 2 (Sunday, February 16, 2025): The United Methodist Church: History, Heritage, Theological emphases, social commitments

Session 3 (Sunday, March 30, 2025): What is a Christian? Faith and Identity

Session 4 (Sunday, April 27, 2025): "Live Your Commitment" - e.g. the vows of membership

#### **Confirmation Sunday:**

Sunday, May 18, 2025 - each youth confirmed in their home church on the same Sunday morning

#### Youth Sunday School - Teaching/ Volunteering Opportunity.

Here at St. Paul's, we plan to start Sunday School classes on the second Sunday of February. If you believe you have the talent, gift, or calling to serve as a Sunday School teacher for our youth, we would love to have you join us! This role can be flexible, with a commitment as little as once a month, and we will plan six weeks in advance. Please let us know if you would like to be part of this crucial and traditional way of carrying out the faith formation component with our youth.
